SUBJECT: **INDUSTRIAL PRETREATMENT: A FOUNDATION FOR
INFRASTRUCTURE PROTECTION**

The City of Marshall Wastewater Department is embarking on the implementation of an Industrial Pretreatment Program. The program will allow the City to maintain federal and state environmental compliance while meeting the demands of local industry. The results of the program ensure protection for our local environment, utility operators, and rate payers. Attendees of the presentation will leave with a background on the program, reasons for implementing it, impacts on existing rate payers, and ongoing operations of the program.
